TLC IS PROUD TO BE PART OF THE NETWORK OF LAND TRUSTS ACROSS THE STATE THAT WORK TO CONSERVE AND PROTECT LAND AND MAKE OUR COMMUNITIES MORE CLIMATE RESILIENT.

CONSERVATION STRATEGIES: IN FY24, TLC PROTECTED 1,544 ACRES OF PRIORITY CONSERVATION LAND, BRINGING OUR TOTAL TO 25,195 ACRES, SURPASSING THE GOAL SET FOR 2025 A YEAR IN ADVANCE. TLC NOW STEWARDS NEARLY 7,600 ACRES ACROSS 89 OWNED PROPERTIES AND PROTECTS 10,684 ACRES THROUGH 184 CONSERVATION EASEMENTS. 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STUDENTS FROM KNIGHTDALE HIGH SCHOOL TO LEARN ABOUT AND EXPLORE CAREER OPPORTUNITIES IN THE OUTDOORS. TO DATE, 16 STUDENTS HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE PINES FELLOWSHIP, OUT OF WHICH 11 STUDENTS HAVE GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL AND GONE ON TO PURSUE STEM STUDIES.
